

INDOOR NETBALL

WEDNESDAY COMPETITION – TERM ONE 2018

COMPETITION DATES

Competition begins on 14 February and concludes on 14 March – 5 playing days.

TEAM AND GAME CONDITIONS

Three grades – Senior: any age (Under 19) and two grades for Junior students: Year 9 and 10 and who are Under 15 on 1 January 2018. If numbers allow, separate competitions will be organised for boys/girls/mixed teams. Priority of entry will be given to senior teams this term.
Mixed teams must consist of boys & girls not meaning mixed year levels.

A team consists of seven players.

2 x 15 minute halves.

Games are scheduled to commence at 3.15pm, 3.45pm, 4.15pm, 4.45pm and 5.15pm.

COMPETITION SCORING

Win = 4, loss = 0, draw = 2, win by default = 6, bonus 1 for every 5 goals scored.

UMPIRES

Umpires will be supplied by the venue.

EQUIPMENT

All equipment is supplied. White (non-marking) soled shoes are to be worn.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Schools are responsible for the health and safety of their students in transit to and from and at the venue. Game officials are responsible for the safety of students during play.

RESULTS

All schools are responsible for in-putting their own results directly into the SportsRunner draw package by 1.00 pm the day following each game.

DEFAULTS

Teams which default, in addition to notifying opponents and any venues if applicable, are required to advise the Regional Sports Director's Office that the team defaulting via email, and is capable of continuing in the competition in subsequent weeks.

CANCELLATION

Cancellation information will be posted on our APP & website by 10am, updated at 12 noon on the day of competition. Heads of Sport will also be advised by email.

ENTRY

Schools are required to enter online via EnterNOW [www.enternow.co.nz], closing on Wednesday 7 February at 1.00pm.

COST

Entry Fee: Schools will be charged \$30.00 per game played in a commercial venue. This will be charged to School account.

This entry is made subject to the Rules governing sports competitions as laid down by the Sport's Directors Office. Under no circumstances will entry fees be refunded once an entry has been accepted. The conditions relating to a default fee of \$30.00 per game defaulted is understood and accepted.



Indoor Netball – Rules for Secondary School Competition

(Applies to All Centres)

1. Team composition

Each team consists of seven players, with unlimited substitutions. Substitutions may only be made when the ball is out of play. The minimum number a team can take the court with is five players. Teams may consist of all boys, all girls, or any combination of boys and girls. There is no restriction on any player positions, unless you have a mixed team where there is a maximum of 3 males on courts at one time, all playing in 3 different quarters
All players in the senior grade must be aged Under 19 on 1 January of the year of competition; all junior grade players must be enrolled in Year 9 or Year 10 and be under the age of 15 on 1 January of the year of competition.

2. Duration: 2 X 15 minute halves,

3. Nets

All nets shall form part of the playing area.

An untouched ball onto the side net from a centre pass is an incorrect centre pass called “Net ball”. A free pass is awarded to the non-offending team at the place where the ball has hit the net.

The nets may be used to regain balance only. A player with the ball may not pass the ball whilst leaning on the net. The player must re-establish balance before making a pass

An untouched ball onto the back net thrown from the center third is “threw a third”; a free pass is awarded to the non-offending team on court where the ball hit the net.

Players may not use the back net to score (free pass to the non-offending team).

Net abuse will not be tolerated. (The offending player will receive one warning and will then be sent from the court.

4. General

Toss-up: The two players contesting the ball shall engage in “toss-up”. Players must attempt to grab the ball with two hands. If a player attempts to hit the ball out a free pass will be awarded to the non-offending team.

If the grounded foot lands in the goal circle then the other foot lands outside the goal circle, the player cannot come back into the goal shoot and shoot: i.e., must pass. Both feet must remain inside the circle always to be able to shoot

5. Jewellery

No nose rings, earrings or any other type of jewellery shall be worn on the court under any circumstances.

6. Uniforms

All players in a team are to wear matching coloured team shirts and skirts/shorts

7. Fingernails

Fingernails must be either: (a) cut short (b) taped effectively (c) gloves may be worn.

8. Behaviour Code

The umpires interpretation of any rules shall be final

Any player engaging in disorderly conduct or unduly rough play, either intentional or unintentional, may be sent from the court for the remainder of the half or the entire game.

Disorderly conduct includes, but is not restricted to, abusive language, time wasting, swearing, disputing an umpire’s decision, physical or verbal intimidation, fighting, etc. No substitutions are allowed for a player sent from the court.

The Sports Director’s Office is to be advised of all such sending off’s, and may take further action in consultation with the offending school’s Head of Sport.

Teams are responsible for their spectators/supporters. Heckling or intimidation from the sidelines shall not be permitted.
