CANTERBURY SECONDARY SCHOOLS SENIOR TOUCH CHAMPIONSHIPS 2020

Saturday 22nd February 2020 Sheldon Park, Belfast

Tournament Conditions

1. The tournament will be conducted under the Rules of the NZ Touch Association.
Extracts:
 - 5.1 A team consists of up to 16 players, no more than 6 players are permitted on the field of play at any one time.
 - 5.2 In mixed competition the maximum number of males allowed on the field is 3 and the minimum required is 1.

For clarity 16 players are allowed per team however only 14 are permitted to play in any one game. The two that are not playing should be made known to the referees and not being wearing the playing strip.
 2. All entrants must be enrolled at a secondary school on the day of the tournament and satisfy NZSSSC eligibility criteria including the new to school quota.
 3. A player may play in only one team.
 4. The structure of the tournament will be determined by the number of entries received.
 5. Play will be continuous throughout the day.
 6. No team shall absent itself from the ground during the hours of play without first obtaining the permission of the Tournament Manager.
 8. Cancellations will be advised via email to team Managers and posted on the Touch Canterbury Facebook and Website by 7.30am.
 9. All games are 15 minute halves with a 3 minute half time.
 10. There will be a hooter for half time, the start of the second half and full time. Two minute music will be played at the start of every game.
 11. All games must be played and no defaults are allowed.
 12. A managers meeting will be held at 8.30am in front of the clubhouse. All team sheets must be completed and handed in before or at this meeting.
 13. If a player is permanently sent from the field then an automatic two match ban in this tournament will be imposed. The player, Touch Canterbury and its officials have the right to appeal the two match ban. If there are not two matches left in the day the tournament will take advice from School Sport Canterbury, the referees and the Touch Canterbury Board regarding the imposition of any further ban.
