WEDNESDAY WINTER COMPETITION

COMPETITION DATES

The competition dates for 2020 have now been revised

Competition begins on Wednesday 24 June until Wednesday 16 September. [9/11 playing days].

Some schools may wish to play friendly/warm up games on 24 June or 1 July and start in term 3, so please state that on your entries.

The competition format for each grade will be determined by the number of teams entered.

VENUES

Schools and neighbouring fields. Also used will be CCC fields; Elmwood, Ray Blank, Hansens, Warren and Avonhead Parks.

GRADES

Girls There are four grades:

Premier	for players of any age (restricted to 12 teams)	11 aside only
Senior	for players of any age, but U19 on 1 January	11 aside and 7 aside
Intermediate:	for players who are in Years 9, 10 or 11	11 aside and 7 aside
Junior	for players who are in Years 9 or 10 only	11 aside and 7 aside

Boys There are three grades (The Boys Premier grade is run by Mainland Football)

Senior	for players of any age, but U19 on 1 January	11 aside and 7 aside
Intermediate:	for players who are in Years 9, 10 or 11	11 aside and 7 aside
Junior	for players who are in Years 9 or 10 only	11 aside and 7 aside

The grade and competition formats will be determined by the number of teams entered.

Generally, this will consist of; grading games if required, a round robin followed by semi finals and final

It may be necessary to combine some grades to ensure viable competitions.

All games are scheduled to commence at 3.15pm (no later than 3.30pm).

Premier & Senior grades play	2 x 35 min halves
Intermediate and Junior grades	2 x 30 min halves

REFEREES

Where possible, referees will be provided for the girls premier games.

Schools will be charged \$15.00 each, where referees are appointed to these games

All other games, first named team in the draw provides referee. Any team failing to provide a referee as required will automatically forfeit the game.

EQUIPMENT

Both teams should provide a suitable ball.

It is a FIFA requirement that all players wear shin pads. Only wear approved safety glasses, not regular glasses when playing.

HEALTH & SAFETY

Schools are responsible for the health and safety of their students in transit to and from and at the venue. Game officials are responsible for the safety of students during play.

Covid-19 all Schools must adhere to the Alert Level requirements in place at each venue used. These may include; Specific hygiene requirements, Contact Tracing, Social Distancing and possibly gathering size.

RESULTS

All schools will be responsible for entering their own results directly into sports runner, by 1pm the day following each game.

School Heads of Sport have the passwords and instructions re this process.

CANCELLATION
