

**CANTERBURY SECONDARY SCHOOLS' ONE DAY HORSE CHAMPIONSHIPS 2020
SCHEDULE and INFORMATION**

Venue: National Equestrian Centre, McLean's Island

Date: Sunday 9th August 2020

Entry: We use **Equestrian Entries** as our event management system. Please follow the link below to enter your teams. Included is a pdf document on how to enter a team using Equestrian Entries.

Entries: close on **Tuesday 28th July 2020**

This event is run at 80cm and 95cm levels

Turnout: will be judged before each team does their Dressage Test.

Dressage Test: for all riders is ESNZ Eventing Dressage Test L5 2018.

Teams: will consist of 4 riders (3 to score), at least two of whom must ride at 95cm level.

The Jane Sullivan Trophy: will be competed for by Secondary Schools which are partner schools of the Canterbury Secondary Schools' Regional Sports Director's Office.

Individual Riders: Schools that have less than three riders, or more riders than can be placed in a team, may submit the names of individual riders who wish to participate, and they will be placed in a composite team by the organising committee. These riders should be entered as a team under their school name even if it is not a team as such. The School Sport New Zealand policy on the entry of composite teams will apply and therefore they will not be eligible for championship trophies. (**School Sport New Zealand Sports 2020 directory page 21**)

Riders: must be under the age of 19 years as 1 January 2020 and fulfil the eligibility criteria for competition in secondary school sport as defined by the School Sport New Zealand. Students in Years 7 & 8 are not eligible to participate.

Priority of entry: will be given to partner schools of the School Sport Canterbury, Regional Sports Directors Office should there be an excess of entries. Entries will be accepted from schools that are not partner schools of the School Sport Canterbury Regional Sports Director's Office; however, these teams will not be eligible to win trophies or other awards. Certificates will be printed to the top three placed teams in line with SSC policy and posted to schools after the event.

Entry Fee: \$46.75, plus \$3.25 online entry fee, plus \$20 ground fee (\$70 per rider) Schools will be invoiced by School Sport Canterbury post event.

Scratchings: will be charged 10% of the Entry fee charge to cover administrative costs.

Cancellation: School Sport Canterbury website and App [details below as to how to download for free].

Catering: Each team to provide 2 plates of food- 1 Savoury/1 Sweet for Officials Catering And Manager's Meeting.

RULES and CONDITIONS

Team members may only be entered by their respective schools for this teams event. The team Manager does not have to be a teacher. We suggest that the manager be someone who is familiar with equestrian events.

1. EVERY RIDER entered MUST provide a helper to assist with either the event set-up, help on the day, or the event pack-up. One helper per team to be named as a XC Fence Judge. A google spreadsheet will be emailed to each team manager to enter the assistance details for each rider.
2. The competition is run under ESNZ Rules for Eventing.
3. A team will consist of four riders on ponies or hacks, at least two of whom must ride at 95cm level. The best 3 scores will count, therefore a team of 3 riders could enter and have all scores count. Individual riders entered will be placed into composite teams by the organising committee. These 'individual' riders from schools that have also entered a team, will be available to their teams as reserves if required.
4. In all SSC and sanctioned competitions and championship events, entry priority will be given to SSC partner schools. Entries from non-partner schools outside the region will be allowed, but only accepted where space and time permits. No team(s) from a non-SSC partner school is eligible to win a regional title or trophy. Any such competitors or teams will however be acknowledged in the results and in the awarding of certificates as gaining first place.
5. As a general rule the hierarchy for acceptance of teams into events will be:
 - a. A teams from SSC partner schools
 - b. B teams from SSC partner schools
 - c. Composite teams from SSC partner schools
 - d. A teams from non-partner schools
 - e. Composite teams from non-partner schools
6. School colours and school team uniform to be worn in all phases. Normal riding jackets are acceptable for the Dressage phase.
7. All riders must wear an NZPCA or ESNZ red-tagged helmet.
8. Plaiting is optional.
9. As the entry fee is subsidised by the School Sport Canterbury sponsorship partnership with the Lion Foundation, the wearing of any conflicting sponsor's logos will not be permitted.
10. One rider - one horse. Riders shall compete on their usual mount. No mounts may be exchanged, borrowed or leased for this occasion. In exceptional circumstances, dispensations to this ruling will be allowed provided written application is made at the time of entry.
11. Any protest shall be lodged in writing by the Team Manager, within 30 minutes of the score being posted. A \$30.00 deposit is required, refundable if the protest is upheld.
12. A \$500.00 bond is paid to Eventing Canterbury, so all participants are to keep the area clean and free of manure, hay and rubbish.
13. All teams shall parade mounted for prize giving.
14. Dogs permitted but must be on a leash.

GUIDELINES for Sports Co-Ordinator/Teacher in charge of Equestrian

Announce the event, date and venue to the School and invite entries.

Distribute the rules and the grade of competition to the prospective competitors.

Request that applicants for team places provide a list of their achievements on their **USUAL MOUNT** ie. grade in which the combination competes, placings, events attended etc.

Nominate combinations 1 - 4.

Appoint a Team Manager for every team. This is the person who will do the on-line entry, **so should be some-one who is familiar with equestrian events.** If you do not have a team as such, and only individual riders, appoint a Manager for this/those riders. Still make the entry as a team of either 1, 2 or 3 riders etc.

The Team Manager is the person who will be responsible for communication with Eventing Canterbury so they will be required to supply their contact details with the on-line entry.

The Team Manager is responsible to supply a **named helper for every rider** with the online entry. A google spreadsheet will be emailed to each team manager to enter the assistance details for each rider.

The Team Manager is responsible for:

- Supervising the team at the event.
- Riders knowing and obeying the rules.
- Riders being on time for their starts.

The Set-Up Working Bee will take place on the Friday before the event at 4.00pm.

Draw and Timetable will be emailed to the team Managers and it is the responsibility of the Manager to distribute all the information to the competing individuals and parents before the event.
