



Volleyball Competitions –Term Four 2020

Competition Dates

Commences **Monday** 12 October then Monday 19 October, **Tuesday** 27 October, Monday 2 November, Monday 9 November (Seniors conclude) Monday 16 November; (Juniors conclude).

Canterbury Senior championships (proposed replacement) Saturday 24 – Monday 26 October

Canterbury Junior Championships: 6 – 8 November.

South Island Junior Championships: 23 – 25 November, Invercargill

South Island Junior Beach Championships: 26 November, Invercargill

Beach Volleyball a term 4 competition will be offered by Canterbury Volleyball, played at Pioneer on Wednesday afternoons. Further information regarding this competition will be forwarded to schools by CVA.

The following are the arrangements for Term 4 competitions

1. **Premier:**

Teams will play one match each week (5 weeks) Games are the best of five sets with no time limit.

Games played in school gyms, the host school is required to provide the referee.

Games played at Pioneer, it is our intentions to have referees appointed to these games, If this does not happen then the first named team is to provide a referee. However we encourage teams to “share” sets with this role.

Depending on the number of entries, Premier Div.2 & 3 Grades may play timed games or best of 3 sets.

Boys Premier Will consist of Two Divisions (Premier Div.1 and Premier Div.2)

Div. 1 In term 4 2020 a new Ladder system will be trialled for possible adoption to all premier grades in term 1 next year

The 8 teams that contested Div. 1 in term 1 will be carried over into the new competition for term 4

RICC A, SHIR A, LINC A, STAC A, MDGR A, BURN A, CASH A, CBHS, A

These teams **should not** be re entered through enterNow for this term

Div. 2 will consist of Div.2 teams from term 1 that want to remain in this grade plus any other teams that schools would like to enter into this grade for term 4. Div. 2 teams must be entered through EnterNow.

Girls Premier:

Div.1 In term 4 2020 a new Ladder system will be trialled for possible adoption to all premier grades in term 1 next year

The 8 teams that contested Div.1 in term 1 will be carried over into the new competition for term 4

STAC A’ STMG A, BURN A, CGHS A, LINC A, CASH A, RRGs A, RICC A

These teams **should not** be re- entered through EnterNow for this term

Div. 2 & 3 will consist of div.2 & 3 teams from term 1 that want to remain in these grades plus any other teams that schools would like to enter into this grade for term 4. Div.2 & 3 teams must be entered through EnterNow.

Unlike previous years the term 4 Premier grade competitions will not be used to determine seedings for qualifying next year. **Therefore Year 13 students, unlikely to return to school in 2021 will be permitted** to play in Premier grade teams this term

2. **Senior Grades** (Students must be under the age of 19 years as at 1 January 2020)

Division 1 is for "experienced and better ability" teams, e.g., the A teams from a school, or the B team from schools acknowledged to be stronger in the sport". Play best of three sets.

Division 2 is for "less experienced and/or less competitive teams". Play best of three sets. The competition will commence on Monday 12 October then Monday 19 October, **Tuesday 27** October, Monday 2 November, Monday 9 November (Seniors conclude)

Teams or individual players which play in this competition may **not** also play in the Premier grades.

All games are of 60 minutes duration.

All games are best of three sets and the result is 2-0 even if a third set is played. (Not 3-0 or 2-1 if a team has already won 2-0)

Teams are encouraged to play a third set if time allows. If the score is 1-1 then the deciding set is to 15, unless if time allows and by mutual agreement of both teams before the start of the set, it may be played to 25. A deciding set counts if one team is 8 or more and ahead by 2 or more points. If the game is to 25 then one team must be on 13 or more points and ahead by 2 for that set to count. A rally in progress when the hooter goes is to be counted.

3. **Junior Grades:** (Students who are enrolled in Year 9 or Year 10 only in 2020. Top Divisions in this grade, take priority at Pioneer Stadium. Entry is unrestricted. Commences Monday 12 October then Monday 19 & Tuesday 27 October, Monday 2, 9 & 16 November,

Individual Year 9 students may play in Junior teams, but teams made up entirely of Year 9 players must be entered in the Year 9 competition. A player may not play in both the Year 9 and Junior competitions. An indication of the "strength" of the team is required at entry.

Teams or individual players which play in this competition may **not** also play in the Premier grades.

All games are 60 minutes duration.

All games are best of three sets and the result is 2 – 0 even if a third set is played. (Not 3-0 or 2-1 if a team has already won 2-0)

Teams are encouraged to play a third set if time allows. If the score is 1-1 then the deciding set is to 15, unless if time allows and by mutual agreement of both teams before the start of the set, it may be played to 25. A deciding set counts if one team is 8 or more and ahead by 2 or more points. If the game is to 25 then one team must be on 13 or more points and ahead by 2 for that set to count. A rally in progress when the hooter goes is to be counted.

4. **Year 9 Grades:** All members of the team must be enrolled in Year 9 in 2020. Dates as for Juniors. An indication of the "strength" of the team is required at entry.

Year 9 Games are of 60 minutes duration.

All Year 9 games are best of three sets and the result is 2 – 0 even if a third set is played. (Not 3-0 or 2-1 if a team has already won 2-0)

Teams are encouraged to play a third set if time allows. If the score is 1-1 then the deciding set is to 15, unless if time allows and by mutual agreement of both teams before the start of the set, it may be played to 25. A deciding set counts if one team is 8 or more and ahead by 2 or more points. If the game is to 25 then one team must be on 13 or more points and ahead by 2 for that set to count. A rally in progress when the hooter goes is to be counted

5. Games in all competitions will be played in school gyms or Pioneer Stadium.
6. Schools are asked to consider making their gyms available on all competition nights. This will include: specifying a "floor controller" who will assume responsibility for the management of games (games commence at 4.00 pm and conclude at approximately 8.00 pm)
This office will reimburse schools \$6 per game played in their school Gym.
It is not necessary that a gym is available every Monday night.
7. Entry Fees: Fees are charged to cover the actual costs of the competition. These include: venue hire, payment of stadia "floor controllers", premier grade referees, student referee development. The entry fee includes a coaching component available to your school.

8. Entry is open to all partner schools of this office. Entry for all grades must be made before the closing time on Monday 21 September via the EnterNow on-line entry system on the SSC website.
A \$10 late fee may apply to any team not entered by closing time.

9. The entry fee will be charged to schools via their account with School Sport Canterbury. No refund will be made to teams which subsequently withdraw from the competition for any reason.

Schools are encouraged to print a copy of entries as they are made on- line as confirmation of entries. Changes to entries can be made any time up until entry closing time.

10. Defaults. When games are defaulted, venues have been hired and floor controllers employed needlessly. Schools which default will bear these costs. It is a condition of entry that schools agree to a default fee of \$20.00 per game on each occasion a team is defaulted. Schools will be advised of defaults charged. This fee will be added to the school account.

Teams which default, in addition to notifying opponents and any venues if applicable, are required to advise the Sports Director's Office that the team defaulting is capable of continuing in the competition in subsequent weeks. A simple explanation on the weekly results sheet sent in by schools will suffice (e.g., team members ill).

Results

Each school is responsible for entering results directly into the Sports runner which is password protected and accessed via the SSC website homepage. www.canterbury.schoolsport.org.nz.

Results must be entered no later than **1pm Tuesday**. (Wednesday for Tuesday games)

Heads of Sport will provide further information regarding this.

RULES OF THE COMPETITION

1. Defaults

A fee of \$20.00 per defaulting team will be imposed in all grades for all defaults regardless of reason. This includes failing to provide a referee as required, which results in an automatic default. This will be charged to the school account. If both teams mutually agree to default they pay half each. If both teams mutually agree to defer a game or play it at another time or venue, then this will not be regarded as a default provided the Sports Director's Office (not the Floor Controller) is advised in advance. It is a condition of entry that schools agree to this fee.

Six players are required to be present at the start of a match or it is forfeited.

2. Game Conditions

All scoring is point rally. Sets are scored up to 25 except the deciding set which is up to 15. If play is governed by time, then a minimum of thirteen points (with a two point advantage) is required for a win in a set to be recorded, i.e. 13/11 is a winning score when time runs out, 13/12, 12/7 or 12/1 are not.

If it is the deciding set, then one team must be 8 or more and ahead by 2 or more points for that set to count. A rally in progress when time runs out continues until the rally is completed.

There are no serving restrictions in Junior grade competitions

Warm ups - Year 9, Junior and Senior competitions. A maximum of three minutes ball skills and two minutes combined net time. All time taken for warm-ups is included in the specified playing time, which commences immediately upon conclusion of the proceeding game. For Premier grade matches a maximum of ten minutes warm up time is permitted.

Substitution – The “Twelve Substitution Rule” applies in all grades.

3. Referees

For all games played in school gyms, the host school will be responsible for providing the referee. Games played at Pioneer the first named team to provide a referee however we encourage teams to “share” sets with this role. Where available referees will be appointed to Premier Div.1 games at Pioneer

4. General Rules

All teams are expected to wear correct school sports uniform. School PE uniform is acceptable in the year 9 grade and Division 3 or 4 in the Junior grades.

Numbers must be worn front and back for all other grades. Teams should have matching tops and shorts. This is compulsory in the Premier teams.

Teams/players may warm up only on a specified court, and not in any areas bounding courts. Team coaches and managers are requested to be vigilant in ensuring that this rule is complied with in the interests of ensuring games in progress are not interfered with. Floor Controllers have the authority to deal firmly with persistent infringements.

Spectators are not permitted to use spare courts at any time.

Health & Safety

The School Sport Canterbury Risk Management plan for Indoor Sports can be viewed on the documents and Volleyball pages of the SSC website.

Schools are responsible for the Health and Safety of their students in transit to and from and at the venue.

Game officials are responsible for the safety of students during play.

Covid-19 all Schools must adhere to the Alert Level requirements in place at each venue used. These may include; Specific hygiene requirements, Contact Tracing, Social Distancing and possibly gathering size.
