

SUMMER HOCKEY
WEDNESDAY COMPETITION – SUMMER TERM ONE 2021

Competition Dates

Competition begins on 17 February and concludes on Wednesday 17 March - 5 playing days.
The competition format will be determined upon the number of teams that enter.

Venues

Nunweek Park, although other venues may be used depending on proximity to the schools that enter.
Games commence at 3.15pm, and every half hour following.

Team and Grade Conditions

6 aside: refer attached “Summer Hockey Rules”. If there are sufficient entries, separate competitions will be held for boys, girls, and mixed grades (one “open” age grade).

In recent years entry numbers have limited the competition to one Mixed grade.

Umpires

Each team provides one umpire (Team members can take turns.)

Results

All schools are responsible for in-putting their own results directly into the SportsRunner draw package by 1.00 pm the day following each game.

Defaults

Teams which default, in addition to notifying opponents and any venues if applicable, are required to advise the Sports Director’s Office via email and that the team defaulting is capable of continuing in the competition in subsequent weeks.

Cancellation

Cancellation information will be posted on our website and App by 10am, up-dated at 12 noon on the day of competition. Heads of Sport will also be advised by email.

Cost

Schools will be charged to their school account an entry fee of \$30.00 per game per team.
This may reduce if other school venues are used.

Health & Safety

Schools are responsible for the health and safety of their students in transit to and from and at the venue. Game officials are responsible for the safety of students during play.
