Provider Notes

Ensure you compare apples with apples when choosing a provider...not all companies are created equal. AOG travel providers and travel agents may not have the group and youth specialist experience you require.

How did your provider fare in the 2020 post COVID cancellation period - do they have a lot of outstanding credits they will be trying to fund?

Think about the potential liability concerns around arranging a tour yourself as a school: when you are acting as a travel agent for a tour, it means you're carrying the responsibility & liability, rather than an external provider.

Group travel allows you to book now, pay later. If you work with the right group expert you don't need to provide names up front and can book hotels and flights with only a deposit, rather than full payment up front.

It is important to note that according to MoE best pratice guidelines, should a School/Board choose to travel with a non-TAANZ Financially Bonded agent/company, parents must be advised of the additional risks associated with this decision and the school must obtain each parent's signed approval.

NB: IATA Accreditation/Bonding alone is not sufficient, as IATA only covers the Airlines for loss of funds, it will not cover the consumer.

EOTC Considerations

Some providers will take you for a selfie at the Google building...some can take you inside to meet and greet - you need to know the difference. You also need to ensure that the activities on tour are age appropriate and meet your curriculum requirements.

If you don't know what you want...ask. An expert provider will know where you need to go to get the experience you're after. They will have all the right contacts to make a truly memorable AND educational tour.

Not all providers truly understand Duty of Care. For example, staying in hostels or billeting can be risky to students' health and wellbeing and expose them to unnecessary personal risk... your provider should know how to get you the prices you need with the security that you MUST have.

Tour booklets with full tour information and emergency details should always be provided to tour participants as part of every single tour.

When do we start planning?

"Yesterday" is the answer to that question! Generally international tour planning starts at least 18-24 months out, so don't be afraid to get the ball rolling early.

Really, what is financially bonding?

- Financial Bonding ensures your funds are protected and not being used for operational costs or another group's tour expenses.
- TAANZ financially bonded companies are independently audited twice yearly by the TAANZ bonding authority to ensure that all client funds are held in separated and bonded accounts.
- TAANZ Financially Bonded companies must also pay a minimum bond fee of \$100,000.00 to the bonding authority to meet the minimum bonding requirements.
